



Alternative Energy Credit (AEC) Program

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the AEC Program?

The AEC Program allows eligible commercial and industrial customers to purchase carbon-free energy attributes from Evergy's Wolf Creek Nuclear Generating Station. Each AEC represents the energy attributes of 1 MWh of nuclear generated, zero emission electricity.

2. Can AECs help with ESG, reporting, or emissions disclosures?

Yes. AECs give customers traceable, certified carbon-free attributes which can be used for sustainability reporting frameworks and internal or customer-driven decarbonization mandates.

3. What are the main benefits of subscribing to AECS?

- Carbon-Free Energy Support: AECs allow customers to incorporate **zero emission nuclear energy** into their sustainability accounting to meet internal carbon reduction or clean energy goals.
- Flexible Subscription Options: Customers can subscribe **1%–100%** of their annual usage and choose **1, 3, or 5 year terms**, enabling predictable, long term planning.
- Predictable pricing: AECs offer **fixed per kWh pricing** based on contract term.

4. How is pricing determined?

- AECs offer fixed per-kWh pricing based on contract term:
 - » **1-year:** \$0.00866 per kWh
 - » **3-year:** \$0.00827 per kWh
 - » **5-year:** \$0.00788 per kWh
- Monthly charges = (Annual Usage × Subscription Level ÷ 12) × AEC Rate (based on term).

5. How do I subscribe?

- Customers sign a **Participation Agreement** specifying:
 - » Subscription level (1–100% of annual usage).
 - » Term length (1, 3, or 5 years).
- Evergy certifies AECs annually through a third party and reports them to subscribers.

6. How will I be billed?

AEC charges are billed **monthly** as a separate line item on your Evergy bill.

7. Can I change or cancel my subscription?

- Changes to subscription level may be allowed under the terms of the Participation Agreement.
- Early termination may result in **termination fees** unless the subscription is transferred to another eligible account or customer.

8. What happens if Evergy cannot supply enough AECs?

If AEC production is insufficient to meet all subscriptions, Evergy will **refund the difference** based on the AEC Rate and the shortfall in subscribed generation.

9. How do I enroll?

Contact your Evergy Customer Solutions Manager or Evergy Renewable team to request enrollment materials and execute a Participation Agreement.
